

INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE, SAFETY, AND MAINTENANCE OF FURNITURE. FURNITURE DISPOSAL INSTRUCTIONS

Thank you for choosing our products. We strive to provide you with the highest quality items,

both in terms of materials used and the technologies applied.

Our furniture has been tested for use in residential interiors and meets safety, durability, and stability standards.

Before using the furniture, please familiarize yourself with these instructions.

I. Furniture Assembly:

- 1. Furniture requiring assembly should be put together according to the assembly instructions, ensuring no parts are damaged during the process.
- 2. To avoid damage, it is recommended to carefully unpack the furniture without using sharp tools.

II. Furniture Usage and Safety Guidelines:

- 1. Furniture should be used in accordance with its design and intended purpose.
- 2. Tables and coffee tables are intended for work or dining. Do not stand, sit, climb, or overload their surfaces or moving parts.
- 3. Furniture should be placed and used on a level surface.
- Use furniture in enclosed, dry spaces protected from factors that may cause damage. Avoid direct sunlight, which can lead to color differences between exposed and shaded areas.
- 5. Climate conditions for furniture use:
 - Relative humidity: 40–70% ;
 - Temperature: +15°C to +30°C;
- Do not place furniture on wet surfaces or closer than 1 meter from active heat sources (e.g., radiators, stoves, dishwashers, humidifiers). Non-compliance may compromise safety and cause damage such as deformation, discoloration, or peeling.
- 7. Avoid contact with sharp objects, pet claws, or other items that can scratch or damage surfaces.

- 8. Protect surfaces from direct exposure to heat, moisture, and chemicals, which may cause discoloration or blistering. Immediately clean and dry any spills.
- 9. Use insulating pads under hot dishes, ensuring they won't leave stains.
- 10. Dragging heavy or sharp objects across surfaces can scratch the finish.
- 11. Do not cut directly on surfaces not designed for this purpose, as knife impacts may cause scratches and water-induced swelling.
- 12. Screws and bolts may loosen over time due to seasonal humidity and temperature changes. Periodically tighten fittings with standard tools.
- 13. Before moving furniture, empty it and secure or dismantle any movable parts.
- 14. Furniture should be carried by an appropriate number of people, holding rigid loadbearing elements. Do not lift by moving parts or horizontal surfaces like tabletops.
- 15. Sliding furniture across the floor may damage both the furniture and the flooring.
- 16. Do not exceed the weight limits specified in the assembly instructions.
- 17. Overloading furniture may cause permanent damage. If any part deforms or bends, immediately reduce the load, check all connections, and ensure stability.

III. Furniture Maintenance Guidelines:

- 1. Clean furniture regularly to prevent the buildup of dust and dirt. Do not allow stains to dry, as they may permanently discolor surfaces.
- 2. Dust laminated or veneered surfaces with soft, dry cloths. Use commercially available furniture care products for maintenance.
- 3. Avoid abrasive cleaning agents, hard sponges, solvents, or chemicals, as they may damage the furniture.
- 4. Do not grease mechanical components.
- 5. Dust metal fittings and avoid abrasive cleaning products.

IV. Disposal Instructions:

- 1. Sorting packaging after assembly:
 - Cardboard, paper: Dispose of in the paper bin (blue in Poland), ensuring all tape and plastic are removed.
 - Tape, plastic elements: Dispose of in the plastic bin (yellow in Poland).

- Dispose of furniture in accordance with large waste disposal regulations. Do not discard furniture in general waste bins or leave it in garbage sheds. Options may include delivering it to a Local Waste Collection Point, scheduling a large waste pickup, or ordering a container for large waste. Check local disposal policies.
